

Considerando que la senadora Kyrsten Sinema firmó una carta al secretario interino del Departamento de Seguridad Nacional (DHS por sus siglas en inglés), Kevin McAleenan, instándole a que adopte un programa llamado Operación Safe Return; y,

Considerando que la propuesta comprimiría en gran medida el período de tiempo durante el cual las solicitudes de asilo se adjudican en detrimento de los aplicantes de asilo y su derecho al proceso debido; y,

Considerando que la propuesta permitiría la deportación acelerada de aplicantes de asilo que no declararon de inmediato un temor creíble de daño en su primera entrevista con un agente de CBP; y,

Considerando es razonable cuestionar la capacidad de CBP para implementar este sistema de una manera que proteja los derechos de los aplicantes de asilo debido a sus recientes fallas en proporcionar un estándar básico de cuidado para los niños bajo su custodia;

Por lo tanto, debe resolverse que el Comité Estatal del Partido Demócrata de Arizona solicite a la Senadora Sinema que abandone esta propuesta y trabaje para ayudar a resolver la crisis de detención en la frontera de manera que coincida con los valores Democráticos de solidaridad, proceso debido, y protección igual; y de una manera que concuerda con las obligaciones de los Estados Unidos en virtud del Artículo 14 de la Declaración Universal de los Derechos Humanos de 1948 y el Protocolo Sobre el Estatuto de los Refugiados de 1967.

Whereas Senator Kyrsten Sinema signed a letter to DHS acting Secretary Kevin McAleen urging him to adopt a program called Operation Safe Return; and,

Whereas the proposal would greatly compress the time period over which asylum claims are adjudicated to the detriment of asylum applicants and their right to due process; and,

Whereas the proposal would permit expedited deportation of asylum applicants who did not immediately cite a credible fear of harm in their first interview with an agent of Customs and Border Protection;

Whereas it is reasonable to question the ability of CBP to implement this system in a manner that protects the rights of asylum applicants given their recent failures to provide a basic standard of care for children in their custody;

Therefore, be it resolved that the State Committee of the Arizona Democratic Party requests that Senator Sinema abandon this proposal and work to help resolve the border detention crisis in a manner that comports with the Democratic values of solidarity, due process, and equal protection; and in a manner that comports with the obligations of the United States under Article 14 of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights of 1948 and the Protocol Relating to the Status of Refugees of 1967.
